2024-25 DOWNTOWN EASTSIDE SMALL ARTS GRANTS: GROUP PROJECTS

If you are an emerging artist group connected to the Downtown Eastside with an idea for an original art project, this program is for you!

What is this program?

The Downtown Eastside Small Arts Grants (DTESSAG) program is a partnership between Carnegie Community Centre and Vancouver Foundation. Our goal is to help emerging artists to develop their skills and increase the visibility of their artwork.

How can this program help me?

Group project grants provide support to emerging artist groups to collaborate in making and showcasing art, and strengthen their interactions through the process. Examples of a group project could include a live performance, a group exhibition, or a video production. Each group may have a maximum of four artists. The budget for your application may range from \$500 - \$1,000 per person. Groups may be 2 to 4 people. Groups may apply for up to a maximum of \$4,000 for groups of 4 people. The total grant awarded will be divided and distributed equally among the artists collaborating within a group. Groups have to tell us in an application how they will use the grant money. With this money, you can buy what you need to take your art to the next level!

What do I need to do?

Apply! In order to receive a grant, artist groups have to complete and submit a grant application. Then, the Volunteer Advisory Committee reviews applications for funding. The Volunteer Advisory Committee is made up of DTES Artists. Please note, <u>not all applicants receive funding</u>. If you are successful in your application, in addition to creating your project, you are required to complete a final report 6 months after receiving your cheque. A Final Report Template will be provided.

When does all this happen?

Applications are open now! If your application is approved for funding, you will receive your cheque approximately eight weeks after you receive your notification. How to submit your application is on page 3.

About the DTES Small Arts Grants for Groups

- 1. Applicants must demonstrate an original art practice. Each group member will be required to submit a sample of their work.
- 2. Groups will need to clearly demonstrate the role of each artist within the project, and how their project will be developed and showcased collaboratively.
- Preference will be given to those applicants who have neither received nor applied for government funding within the past three years (e.g. BC Arts Council, Canada Council, Creative BC).
- 4. Group projects must be presented to the public. The project funder will need to be acknowledged. Possible wording includes, "This project was (partially) funded by the DTES Small Arts Grants Program and Vancouver Foundation", or "The artists appreciate funding received from the DTES Small Arts Grants Program and Vancouver Foundation". Contact the Coordinator for approved logos.
- 5. Grants are not intended to pay for food, rent, or studio rent. Artists cannot pay themselves a salary, however, they may hire others to help them achieve the goals of their project (e.g. web designers, printers, actors, lighting technicians, recording engineers).
- 6. Artists may build capital costs directly related to the proposed project into their group budget. A capital cost is a one-time purchase of a necessary item or equipment that will be used for this and future art projects and does not get 'used up' (like paint or clay) in the process of making the art. A grinder or a camera would be an example of a capital cost. Capital costs may not exceed \$200 per group member.
- 7. Preference will be given to new projects or those applicants who have been funded for fewer than three years in a row.
- 8. Group members may develop a web page on the vancouverfoundationsmallarts.ca website to showcase their project(s). They must have a contact phone number with voicemail, and be working towards having their own email address for online communication.
- Please note that if you apply for an Individual grant, you will not be eligible to apply for a Group grant, and vice versa. Artists applying for more than one grant will be disqualified.
- 10. Grants are for art projects that begin after the grant decision is made in and end by June 30. Grants may not be used for retro-funding (e.g. if your event date is before your application is approved, the application is not eligible for funding).

- 11. Your artwork must follow acceptable community standards. DTES Small Arts Grants do not support works that exploit an individual's vulnerability. For example, when photographing, ask yourself: "Would I like to be photographed or videotaped in this situation?"
- 12. All projects must be completed and your group's Final Report submitted by the end of June in order to be eligible to re-apply the following year. Final Reports must include images and/or video of your project presentation.

How do you apply?

- You must use the DTES Small Arts Grants Group application form to apply for a grant.
- You may attend an information session to get help with your application, contact coordinator for dates and times.

Project Completion

 All projects must be completed and final reports submitted by June 30 of the program year.

Additional information

- Successful applicants who have not been funded before may be required to provide proof
 of their Social Insurance Number to begin processing payment.
- Vancouver Foundation staff appreciate the opportunity to make site visits. In some cases, we may ask to highlight your project for use in our communications and publications.
