If you are an emerging artist connected to the Downtown Eastside with an idea for an original art project, this program is for you!

What is this program?

The Downtown Eastside Small Arts Grants (DTES SAG) program is a partnership between Carnegie Community Centre and Vancouver Foundation. Our goal is to help emerging artists develop their skills and increase the visibility of their artwork.

How can this program help me?

We support emerging artists develop their skills and increase the visibility of their artwork with grant awards ranging from \$500 - \$1000 to individual DTES Artists. With this money, you can buy what you need to take your art to the next level!

What do I need to do?

Apply! In order to receive a grant, artists have to complete and submit a grant application. Then, the Volunteer Advisory Committee reviews applications for funding. The Volunteer Advisory Committee is made up of DTES Artists. Please note, <u>not all applicants receive funding</u>. If you are successful in your application, in addition to creating your project, you are required to complete a final report approximately 6 months after receiving your cheque. A Final Report Template will be provided.

When does all this happen?

Applications are open now! If your application is approved for funding, you will receive your cheque approximately eight weeks after you receive your notification.

Visual artists: Send THREE (3) separate images

Accepted formats:

- Prints/photocopies no larger than 8.5" x 11" each labelled with a title and your name
- Digital images THREE (3) separate files (3 JPEGs or PDFs), each file not exceeding 2 MB.

NOTE: All files must be named with the artist's last name and image's title separated by an underscore '_' (e.g. Smith_WonderlandScene).

Videographers: All samples combined must not exceed TEN minutes.

NOTE: Please select work from within the past five years.

Musicians: THREE (3) recorded original songs and their lyrics and/or charts.

Accepted formats:

Writers: Content should be at least 1000 words. For poetry send 10 poems or 500 words, whichever is less.

Accepted formats:

NOTE: Include where your work has been seen/published.

Performers: Send us a list of places where you have performed.

Terms and Conditions: DTES Small Arts Grants Application

- 1. Applicants must demonstrate an original art practice. Artists are required to submit a sample of their work.
- Preference will be given to applicants who have neither received nor applied for government funding within the past three years (e.g. BC Arts Council, Canada Council, Creative BC).
- 3. Preferences will be given to new projects or those applicants who have been funded for fewer than three years in a row.
- 4. Artists must present their work to the public. Artists are required to acknowledge funders as part of that presentation. Possible wording includes "This project was (partially) funded by the DTES Small Arts Grants Program and Vancouver Foundation", or "The artist appreciates funding received from the DTES Small Arts Grants Program and Vancouver Foundation". Contact the Coordinator for approved logos.
- 5. Grants are not intended to pay for food or rent (personal or studio). You cannot pay yourself a salary. However, you may hire others to help you achieve the goals of your project (e.g. web designers, printers, actors, lighting technicians, recording engineers).
- 6. Please note, we generally do not support community projects or celebrations, although there are certain exceptions, e.g. if an artist is developing a dance piece for certain celebrations. Review Vancouver Foundation's Grants criteria as your project may be eligible for funding through different programs.

- You may build educational costs and capital costs into your project budget. The sum of both may not exceed \$200. Educational costs include things such as taking a course or purchasing instructional materials.
- 8. A capital cost must be directly related to the proposed project. A capital cost is a one-time purchase of a necessary item or equipment that will be used for this and future art projects and does not get 'used up' (like paint or clay) in the process of making the art. A grinder or a camera would be an example of a capital cost. The sum of your capital cost plus your educational cost may not exceed \$200.
- Artists must have a contact phone number with voicemail and be working towards having their own email address for online communication.

- 10. Artists receiving their 3rd grant are required to develop a gallery page on the vancouverfoundationsmallarts.ca website.
- 11. Artists may apply for one DTES Small Arts Grant per year. If you apply for an Individual grant, you are not eligible to also apply for a Group grant, and vice versa. Artists applying for more than one grant will be disqualified.
- 12. Grants are for art projects that begin after the grant decisions are made. Grants may not be used for retro-funding.
- 13. Artwork must follow acceptable community standards. DTES Small Arts Grants do not support works that exploit an individual's vulnerability. For example, when photographing, consider: "Would I like to be documented in this situation?"
- 14. All projects must be completed and Final Reports submitted by the end of June to fulfill grant requirements. Not completing the project and/or submitting a final report by the end of June will result in Artists being ineligible to re-apply the following year.
 - Final Reports must include images and/or video of your project presentation.
 - A Final Report Template can be provided.
 - Please ask program coordinator for support if you have questions about meeting these requirements.

How do you apply?

- You must use the DTES Small Arts Grants application form to apply for a grant.
- You may attend an information session to get help with your application, contact coordinator for dates and times.
